SUBJECT: Authorize Issuance of Purchase Orders in the Total Amount of \$1,085,966.22; \$809,298.22 to Ford Country, \$245,868 to Wired Designs, and \$30,800 for Miscellaneous Items to be Installed by Fleet Staff, Using the Competitive Bidding Exception per NRS 332 Local Government Purchasing Act for the Purchase of Eleven 2018 Ford Tauruses and Seventeen 2018 Ford Explorer Police Interceptors and the Associated Upfits for the Police Department. RECOMMENDATION OR RECOMMEND MOTION: That the City Council approve the purchase of eleven 2018 Ford Tauruses and seventeen 2018 Ford Explorer Police Interceptors in the amount of \$809,298.22, the associated upfit costs in the amount of \$245,868.00, and the miscellaneous items to be installed by Fleet staff in the amount of \$30,800.00 utilizing the competitive bidding exception provided in NRS 332.115(1)(c) and (d).

STAFF COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

This request is to purchase replacements for three 2006 and three 2007 Ford Five Hundreds, four 2005 and one 2008 Ford Taurus's, two 2006, five 2007, six 2008, one 2009 and three 2010 Ford Crown Victorias. The vehicles flagged for replacement have reached their life expectancy due to age, mileage, and/or high maintenance and repair costs. Most also require full body repaints which would cost the City approximately \$4,000 per vehicle. In addition, several vehicles have recurring mechanical issues costing the City thousands of dollars per vehicle every couple of years.

In an effort to reduce these costs, Fleet recommends replacing the current vehicles with new vehicles now before increased maintenance and repair costs, part availability, and vehicle down time adversely

impact Fleet's budget and the operations of both Fleet and the Police Department. At Fleet's discretion, the vehicles being replaced will be sent to auction, used as reserve vehicles, or used for parts depending on the condition of the vehicle at time of replacement. Currently, PD uses the existing reserve vehicles on a consistent basis in order to remain operational while their vehicles are in for repairs.

Pursuant to NRS 332.195(1)(c) and (d), the City is authorized to forego the standard competitive bidding procedure in order to maintain consistent vehicle platforms for efficiencies in Fleet's maintenance and repair program, training and parts inventory.
