Traffic congestion around schools is common before and after school as parents drop off and/or pick up their children.

This congestion can get severe, causing bus loading zones, driveways, legitimate parking places, and crosswalks to be blocked.

This presents not only a frustrating situation for all involved, but is also a dangerous problem for children. They often cross the street mid-block, passing between cars which may be illegally parked two or three deep.

This brochure provides tips on what you can do to be part of the solution.

TIPS ON HOW TO BE PART OF THE SOLUTION

- **Walk your children to school** whenever possible. If they are old enough to walk to school on their own, teach them how to walk safely to school, and always encourage them to use the crosswalk.
- **Share rides with other families** to reduce the number of cars around each school.
- **Do not park in red zones** or block bus unloading areas.
- **Park legally**, even if it's away from the school. Walk your child from your parking location to the school grounds, if necessary.
- **Do not double park** by the school. Pull up to the curb to drop off or pick up your child, then safely move away. If no approved curb area is available park away from the school and walk your child to school.
- **Do not allow your children to cross the street mid-block** if you drop them off or pick them up across the street from the school. Insist that they walk down to a crosswalk before they cross the street. Lead by example.
- **Do not make U-turns** near the school. Drive around the block or follow a different route home after you leave the school.
- **Obey all traffic signs** and school crossing guards.

PARENTS

Traffic congestion near schools is both frustrating and dangerous and we need your help to improve the safety and welfare of school children.

Education about things you can do to help, is our goal with this brochure. The North Las Vegas Police Department is asking for your cooperation in changing what you might be doing and following our suggestions about things you can do to be part of

the solution. We would rather gain your support and cooperation through an educational partnership than to take enforcement action in its absence.

Remember that it only takes a few extra moments to follow these tips and reduce the congestion and diminish this dangerous situation. If everyone abides by these guidelines, your experience in dropping off or picking up your child will be quicker, less frustrating and above all, safer for everyone involved.
